Dear ERC Commissioners:

Greetings!

This pertains to our study of Province of Siquijor Electric Cooperative Inc. (PROSIELCO) financial statements showing an over collection of P8,433,896.00 from 2006 to 2008.

Our finding is based on this Honorable Commission's *Unbundling Decision* dated 14 August 2003 under ERC Case No. 2001-937 granting PROSIELCO's annual revenue requirement of P15,372,404.00 (net of purchased power cost).

To determine if PROSIELCO was getting its ERC-approved annual revenue requirement, NASECORE studied PROSIELCO's 2006-2009 annual reports and compared its ERC-approved annual revenue requirements against its actual annual revenues as shown in the table below:

The table above clearly shows that PROSIELCO realized an accumulated over-collection in the amount of P8,433,896.00 (net of purchased power cost) from 2006-2008. We still need to look into the 2009-2010 annual reports of PROSIELCO to find out if there are also an over collection in the said years.

We find these over-collections alarming because we take this as an abuse of market power when PROSIELCO decided to deliberately keep to itself these over-collections instead of disclosing these by way of a petition to reduce its current rates but maintaining its approved annual revenues, especially that PROSIELCO is *a non-stock, non-profit organization*.

It is common industry knowledge that this increase in its annual revenues is attributable to the increase in its annual sales in kilowatt-hours and kilowatt from its captive customers owing to the increasing consumption of its customers and the reduction in its system loss. (emphasis supplied)

We also find this alarming because these PROSIELCO over-collections show that the Honorable Commission blatantly failed to closely monitor and review the operations of PROSIELCO to determine whether the annual revenue it granted PROSIELCO is what is actually being collected only from the consumers based on its approved annual cost of service including its system loss percentage which should be reflected if the utility is operating efficiently or not.

Had ERC done its primary duty of reviewing the annual revenues it granted PROSIELCO it would have easily discovered these over-collections which NASECORE, on its own initiative, have discovered. It appears that ERC needs some reminding on its legal mandate of ensuring adequate promotion of consumer interests which basically revolves on determining just and reasonable rates.

Further, this ERC failure lamentably renders its approved annual revenues for PROSIELCO (the result of its exhaustive study to ensure the viable operations of the electric utility) inutile as it failed to use these to serve as its way of ensuring that the PROSIELCO rates it granted are just and reasonable.

In this regard, we urge ERC to immediately conduct a regulatory audit of PROSIELCO and reduce its rates so as to stop this over-collection and to immediately direct a refund of this over-collection.

We fervently hope ERC will swiftly act on this request based on its mandate to protect consumers from unjust and unreasonable rates.
